Re: Jorge Mulligan's request for Pardon

Dear Governor

I humbly request that I had the crime of XYZ State for a drug offence for which I was accused, pleaded guilty, sentenced, and conditionally discharged in 2020. Now I desire to become an American citizen but the consequence of this single criminal conviction ten years ago resulted in the denial of my naturalization application and resulted in additional removal procedures.

Since I loved my wife, I focused on earning her forgiveness while I awaited my probation to end. While serving time in prison, I worked two jobs at home to keep my household afloat. My spouse was a career prospect for the Texas Board of Education but she left her job last year to be able to take care of our son, who is struggling with Sickle cell disease.

Since 2015, I haven't had any issues or issues reporting on my green card. Additionally, I was able to use my green card effectively to engage in travelling in and out of this country with no disruptions from immigration enforcement authorities. It was solely because I was applying to become a US citizen that the Department of Homeland Security discovered my conviction, US Citizenship and Immigration Services denied my application, and I was placed under removal proceedings.

My wife is currently being subjected to a great deal of stress and is currently being diagnosed with bipolar disorder in view of my pending petition in a federal court and my possible deportation. My U.S. resident wife will encounter a great deal of hardship if I'm not allowed to remain in the United States, given that I am the sole caregiver of my wife and two elderly relatives.

I am very thankful for your generosity, and when this advantage is granted, it will allow me to request executive clemency prior to being deported. The attached documents, therefore, have been kept as proof of my innocence and have been shown to be sound by the available evidence and legal threats signed on my behalf by my wife and employer.
